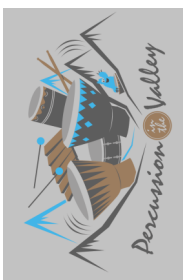

Dr. Aube is a percussion performer and educator living in Palmer, AK. She maintains her teaching studio of over 40 students, Percussion in the Valley. The studio offers private and group lessons, classes and workshops to students of all ages. In addition, she is an adjunct professor at Mat-Su College and UAA. She performs actively as a soloist and in many ensembles throughout the state. Dr. Aube earned her bachelor's of music from UAA and her master's and Doctor of Musical Arts degree from the University of Iowa under the instruction of Dan Moore.

#### John Damberg, Anchorage, AK



John Damberg is a master vibist, marimbist, percussionist, composer, and educator who has enjoyed a successful career in music spanning 50 years. John resides in Anchorage where he is the leader of the John Damberg Latin Jazz Quintet, the instructor of percussion at UAA, the founder and president of the Alaska Jazz Workshop, a non-profit community service organization promoting jazz education and performance opportunities in Alaska. He is the past president and vice president of the Percussive Arts Society Alaska Chapter. John is an active performer and educator in Alaska and the Pacific Northwest. He is an ardent promoter of jazz and percussion education.



#### Tyler Martin, Wasilla, AK

Tyler Martin is a percussionist and music teacher living in Wasilla, AK. Before moving to Alaska, Tyler taught middle school and high school band in Mobile, Alabama. He is now the director of bands at Wasilla High School. Throughout his career he has taught drumline, concert band, orchestra, marching band, jazz band, percussion ensemble, and private lessons. Tyler graduated with a bachelor's degree in music education from Auburn University in 2018 and earned a master's degree in music education from William Carey University.



#### Kyle Drake, Anchorage, AK

Kyle graduated with a bachelor's in music from the University of Alaska Anchorage in 2006. In 2008 he earned his Masters of Arts in Teaching through UAA. For the past 17 years Kyle has been teaching elementary music for the Anchorage School District. Kyle has studied percussion from the age of 11, studying with instructors John Damberg, Greg Holloway and Robert Arms to name a few.
